Veterans Day - We're Still Honoring Those Who Served

On November 11, 2013 the nation commemorated Veterans Day, in honor all who served the United States across all branches of the military. The Steamship Historical Society would like to thank all of our members and friends who served, as well as those around the country who have bravely defended the U.S. over the years.

In honor of our veterans, we've pulled together interesting "This Day in History" naval facts for November 11, from www.navv.mil.

This Day in History on November 11

1870 - Navy expedition to explore the Isthmus of Tehuantepec, southern Mexico, commanded by Capt. Robert W. Shufeldt, enters the Coatzacoalcos River to begin a survey for a possible interoceanic canal. Support provided by USS *Kansas* and USS *Mayflower*.

1918 - Armistice ends World War I.

1920 - Lenah S. Higbee becomes the first woman to be awarded the Navy Cross, awarded for her World War I service.

1921 - Washington Naval Conference begins.

1943 - Two Carrier Task Forces strike Japanese shipping at Rabaul, sinking one carrier and damaging other ships. Raid was first use of SB2C Curtiss Helldivers in combat.

1954 - November 11 designated as Veterans Day to honor veterans of all U.S. wars.

1966 - Launch of *Gemini 12*, with Commander James A. Lovell, Jr., as the Command Pilot. Mission lasted 3 days, 22 hours and 34 minutes and included 59 orbits at an altitude of 162.7 nautical miles. Recovery by HS-11 helicopter from USS *Wasp* (CVS-18).

Remembering the "White Hurricane" of 1913

One hundred years ago, between November 7-10, 1913, a disastrous winter storm struck the Great Lakes region, resulting in the loss of a dozen ships and an estimated 250 people - the largest inland maritime natural disaster in U.S. history according to NOAA. Blizzard conditions and hurricane-strength winds brought on 90 mph winds with 35-foot seas. White-out conditions and the icing of the ships made navigation nearly impossible for vessels out on the Lakes.

In 1913, forecasters with the Weather Bureau sent messages via telegraph to stations along the shores of the Great Lakes, and there, flags would be flown from shore notifying any vessels within viewing distance that unfavorable weather was approaching. Unfortunately for those ships already far from shore, this weather information was beyond their reach. Although wireless communication was become

wireless communciation was becoming increasingly more common, it is likely that most of the ships that went down in the 1913 storm were not yet using wireless communication systems, according to NOAA.

November remains a dangerous time of year on the Great Lakes due to intense storms. Countless vessels have been lost during this month, including the *Daniel J. Morrell* in 1966 and the *Edmund Fitzgerald* in 1975.
