The Concrete Wreck

Jim Leggett offers a brief history of the SS *Sapona*, a ferroconcrete steamer that ran aground near Bimini in 1926 and is now a navigational landmark for boaters and a popular dive site. The *Sapona*, designed by Henry Ford and built in 1919 by Liberty Ship Building Co. in Brunswick, Georgia, was constructed of concrete to conserve precious steel during World War I.

Harriman chartered and refitted the *George W. Elder* for his famous scientific Alaska Expedition.

From December 1941 through 1944, German and Italian U-boats sank 181 ships off the U.S. coast. Seventy of the ships were U.S.-flagged steam ships or motor tankers, and most of them had sailed from or were headed to the port of New York. Capt. Floating Library Aboard the SS *Lilac*

America's only surviving lighthouse tender, the SS *Lilac*, is embarking on a new adventure as a floating pop-up library on the Hudson River.

The creation of artist
Beatrice Glow, the Floating
Library will be aboard
the *Lilac* from September
6th through October 3rd.
The *Lilac* is berthed at Pier
25 at the Hudson River
Park, at North Moore and
West Streets.

Admission aboard is free, and visitors can take part in various activities, such as craft sessions on bookbinding and jewelry

making. The officer's quarters and other rooms on the *Lilac* feature shelves containing a variety of books and seating. Visitors are encouraged to stay and read in the numerous nooks aboard the ship—including the ship's main deck that has been transformed into a reading lounge—surrounded by sounds of the harbor. A small exhibit features original musical compositions inspired by displayed books, to which visitors can listen with

Wreck of 148-Year-Old Three Masted Schooner Found

The Great Lakes Historical Shipwreck Society announced on September 8th that they have recently located the 199 foot, three masted schooner *Nelson*. Built in 1866, the *Nelson* sank near Grand Marais, Michigan, after foundering in heavy weather in May 1899. The *Nelson* was in tow of the wooden steamer *A. Folsom*, along with the schooner *Mary B. Mitchell* bound for Michigan's Keweenaw Peninsula. A northwest gale with freezing

rain and 50 mph winds descended on the trio and thick ice soon formed on the ships' decks.

Captain A. E. White of the *A*. *Folsom* was attempting to turn the ships and head for the cover of WhitefishBay when he witnessed the Nelson's towline part and the schooner

rapidly sinking. He later noted that "...the Nelson disappeared as suddenly as one could snuff out a candle." There was only one survivor among the Nelson's 10 person complement.
